## Male Playoff Match-ups

### **Game 51 - UFA Bisons (3-0-1) vs. Calgary Flames (2-1-1)**

The UFA Bisons won Pool 1 with a strong record of three wins and one tie. They won their first game against the Vancouver NW Giants by a convincing margin of 6-2. They followed this game with a stalemate against the strong Beardy's Blackhawks team. They came back from the tie to win with a score of 6-4 against the Edmonton SSAC Boston Pizza Athletics. They finished the tournament with a 3-1 win against the Sherwood Park J. Ennis Kings. The Bisons finished the tournament with 16 goals for and only 8 goals against.

The Calgary Flames were in highly-contested Pool 5, and finished with a record of two wins and two ties. The Flames started strong in the opening ceremonies game against the Greater Vancouver Canadiens with a score of 11-1. They played the next game against the Russian Severstal/Locomotiv and scored in the last minute to tie the game 4-4. The Flames came back from the tie to shutout the Red Deer Optimist Rebels with a score of 3-0. The Flames lost their final game to the Saskatoon Blazers with a score of 6-4. The Flames finish the tournament with 22 points for and 11 points against.

### **Game 52 - Prince Albert Mintos (4-0-0) vs. Calgary Northstars (4-0-0)**

The Prince Albert Mintos won Pool 2 by winning all four of their games in regular tournament play. The Mintos had an impressive tournament and only allowed one goal in each of their four games. Their first game against the Leduc Chrysler Oil Kings finished with a score of 5-1, the second against the Calgary Buffaloes ended with their closest score of the tournament at 3-1. The team beat the York Simcoe Express with a score of 8-1 before finishing off the tournament with their biggest win, against the Okanagan Rockets with a score of 9-1. The Mintos finished the tournament with an impressive 25 goals for and only 4 goals against.

The Calgary Northstars went undefeated in their four games of regular tournament play to win Pool 4. The Northstars won their first game against the Fort Saskatchewan BP Rangers with a score of 3-1. Their next game they shut out the Tisdale Trojans 6-0. The Northstars played a feature game against the Pirati Chomutov team and beat them in a high scoring game (6-3). The Northstars won their final match with a single goal scored in the second period to beat the Cariboo Cougars 1-0. The Northstars finish the tournament with 16 points for and only four against.

### **Game 53 - St. Albert Sports Raiders (4-0-0) vs. Beardy's Blackhawks (2-0-2)**

The St. Albert Sport Raiders finished regular tournament play with a perfect record, to win Pool 3. After winning their first game against the Vancouver NE Chiefs with a score of 4-1, the Raiders kept that momentum going with two close games against the Saskatoon Contacts (2-1) and a last second win against the Calgary Royals (3-2). The Raiders finished strong with a 10-1 win against the Valley West Hawks. The Raiders finished with a record of 19 goals for and only 5 goals against.

Beardy's Blackhawks split their games in regular tournament play with two wins and two ties. The Blackhawks started the tournament strong, winning their first game against the Sherwood Park J. Ennis Kings by a score of 4-3. Their next game ended in a 1-all tie against the UFA Bisons. The Blackhawks' next game was a high scoring event with a win of 7-5 against the Vancouver NW Giants. The Blackhawks finished round-robin with a 4-4 tie against the Edmonton SSAC BP Athletics, giving them a total of 16 points for and 8 points against.

### **Game 54 - Russia Severstal/Locomotiv (2-0-2) vs. Pirati Chomutov (3-1-0)**

The Russian Severstal/Locomotiv team managed to get into the playoffs by winning Pool 5 by a small margin. The team finished the round-robin with two wins and two ties. Russia's first game against the Red Deer Optimist Rebels finished in a tie (3-3) before rebounding nicely to win against the Greater Vancouver Canadiens by a more convincing margin of 8-1. The next matchup for the Russians was a feature game against the Calgary Flames, which ended in a 4-4 tie. Severstal/Locomotiv rallied back in the next game to win 4-1 over the Saskatoon Blazers. The team finished with a record of 19 goals for and 9 goals against.

The Pirati Chomutov enter the playoffs with a strong record of 3 and 1 in Pool 4. The team won its first game against the Cariboo Cougars 4-2. Their next game was against the Fort Saskatchewan BP Rangers, where they came away with a 6-2 victory. Pirati Chomutov won their third match 4-1 before losing their final game to the Calgary Northstars, 6-3 in a packed Max Bell feature game. The Pirati Chomutov finish with 17 goals for and 11 goals against.

## Female Playoff Match-ups

### Game F31 - Saskatoon Stars (4-0-0) vs. Edmonton Thunder (4-0-0)

The Saskatoon Stars went undefeated, getting two points in all four round-robin games to win Pool 7. The first win came against the Calgary Bruins with a close score, 4-3. The Stars won their next two games against the Lloydminster PWM Steelers and Red Deer Sutter Fund Chiefs, both with a score of 5-3. They had a shutout in their final match by a large margin, 9-0 against the Vancouver Fusion. The Saskatoon Stars finish with 23 goals for and 9 against.

The Slash started their streak against the Prince Albert A&W Bears with a score of 5-1. Continuing their success the team shut out the Thompson-Okanagan Rockets with a score of 5-0. The Slash finished the tournament strong by beating the Calgary Flyers 3-1 in their final game and finished the tournament with 15 goals for and 4 against.

The Regina Rebels took the wild card spot with three wins and one loss. This came down to the last game of round-robin when the Medicine Hat Tigers tied the Prince Albert A&W Bears 3-3 in the last seconds. The Rebels started the tournament strong beating the Westman Wildcats with a close score of 2-1. 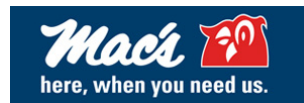
